Principal's Welcome- May'22

I am blessed to be the Principal of Gurteen College. The role affords me so many superb opportunities, so I thought I would take the opportunity to share just a few of those recent experiences.

At our recent graduation ceremony, I had the pleasure of talking to families of the graduates, no matter if it was the proud father whose daughter had just completed a full-time course or a wife whose husband had just completed the adult part time course the theme was the same. Gurteen had changed their life, the College staff offered superb support, the farm and facilities were first class, and they had made a connection with fellow graduates that will last for life.

Just a few days later I was meeting Prof. Frank OMara the director of Teagasc and we discussed the important scientific research that aims to measure an understand the flows of carbon in and out of agricultural soils. Data is being collected at Gurteen part of a national research project using "eddy flux towers" we hope the research will provide some important guidance how farmers can best manage soil carbon

Last week a combination of staff leave, and illness, resulted in the Gurteen farm requiring a relief milker - I was delighted by the news as it gave me a legitimate opportunity to relive some memories of my early career and don a milking apron. Thanks must be recorded to the very patient farm staff who expertly coached me.

Throughout spring our focus has been on student recruitment. Gurteen is actively visiting schools, hosting class visits to our campus and running course information days. At the last course information day I spoke to two families with quite different backgrounds – a farming family from Donegal who are hoping their daughter would be the third generation to study at Gurteen when she joins the course in September, and a family from Limerick who had no real connection to agriculture – but their son wants to work with cows and they have been told Gurteen will 'look after their son and give him real hands on experience' It is such a delight to meet so many talented and enthusiastic young people who want to forge a career in agriculture.



Farm Update

It has been a very busy spring on the farm in Gurteen. Calving and lambing are now over, and both went very successfully. Our farm team worked very hard and their efforts are reflected in the results. Our tillage students have finished sowing the spring crops. In March we harvested the willow that heats the college, and our yields were up on last year. Grass growth was slow in the early season, but the milder weather has brought growth. Input prices are very high but hopefully the current high milk price will continue, and it will do much to balance out the rising costs. Our thoughts are now focused on the current breeding season as well as silage making and reseeding.

Researchers for TUS (Technical University Shannon) are conducting a butterfly population monitoring program as well as a broader habitat survey, and Gurteen is taking part in a nation pollinator survey, these should yield some interesting data and hopefully we will be able to improve our habitats on the farm as we learn more.









Course Update

Fulltime Level 5 students returned to college on Monday 28th of March after completing their second 4-week farm placement period. Our Level 6 students are still on placement and have a further 4 weeks to complete of their 16 week's placement.

Before placement commenced, Level 5 students participated in various fun activities organised by themselves as part of their Personal Effectiveness module. Events such as Tug of War, Welding and Stock Judging all occurred on the day with all money raised being donated to local charity. A very fun day was had by all including staff and it was great to see students enjoy such an eventful day, highlighting the importance of fun activities as part of their curriculum.

In recent weeks, teaching staff have been involved in delivering a range of practical skills to veterinary nurse students from Dun Laoghaire and TUS (Athlone Campus). Skills were delivered across a range of areas including, dairy, cattle, sheep, calves, and equine.

"I'm Maialen, I'm 25 and I come from the Basque country, which is just southwest of France. I have just finished my veterinary studies in Spain in December, and I chose to do an Erasmus internship a Gurteen to get a new experience and the opportunity to get some experience about farming and large animals.

I've enjoyed my time at Gurteen, though it's true that English is more difficult for me than expected and the culture and habits are really different from what I am use to- but it's been really interesting to get out of my comfort zone.

While here at Gurteen I've been involved with a number of different jobs on the farm. In February I worked with the dairy cows, and in March I worked mostly with the sheep. Working with both areas let me appreciate the differences between these two species. I've been feeding calves, cleaning pens, lambing- all the stuff farmers are used to doing but I'm not!

I don't really know what I'd say my favourite thing I've gotten to do is while here at Gurteen. I would say maybe to take care of lambs and to help with lambing, but the whole experience in general has been really interesting for me.

After Gurteen, I would like to take time to review my lessons and what I've learnt. After that I will start working in a vet clinic near Poitiers in the west of France. These are my plans for the moment, but I already know that I won't be in the same place for a long time, because there are too many places and too many things for me to discover in this world!"

Gurteen in partnership with TUS are extremely excited to announce that they're launching a **new honours degree programme Agricultural Science & Sustainability in** September 2022!

The aim of this course is to produce graduates with knowledge and skills in agriculture with a focus on sustainability. While the course provides the students with a sound theoretical basis for understanding complex agricultural and environmental phenomena within a sustainable development context, its focus is on the practical application of knowledge and skills including agri-business and on-farm settings

This development means that a student can enrol at Gurteen on a level 5 agriculture course and graduate from the College with an honour's degree. Many previous forms of The Technological University of the Shannon have been a trusted partners of Gurteen, so as AIT and LIT merged to form TUS the timing felt correct to work with colleagues from the Thurles campus of the new university and develop a bespoke new degree programme building on the heritage and strong foundations of both Gurteen and TUS.

• Full level 8 Honours degree, **4 year programme**, with options for second year entry if you have a level 6 in ag, and options to leave after year 3 with an ordinary degree.

• Approx. ½ of the curriculum is focused on agricultural production and ½ on sustainability, all employers tell us sustainability is where the future jobs exist, we know that water quality/methane/carbon/biodiversity will be key topics in farming for the next 10-15 years.

• Expect graduates will be in demand and could secure jobs in roles such agricultural advisors, farm auditors, environmental officers/scientists with agribusinesses, the public sector and NGOs, or as researchers, consultants. and of course as farmers.

• TUS have vast experience and are highly respected in the sustainability sector, complimenting the heritage and strength of Gurteen.

• Gurteen will deliver the agricultural topics - **the degree will give the graduates 'young trained farmer status' otherwise called "the green cert"**

• Two full semesters will be taught entirely at Gurteen, one semester is a work placement for the remaining five semesters the students will be based at Thurles.

• Approx. 42% of the total teaching will be delivered by Gurteen staff

• Gurteen farm will be used extensively as an outdoor laboratory /classroom - and by farm I mean everything the cows, crops, sheep but also the lough, bog, woodland, hedgerows etc.



Gurteen College- Diamond Anniversary
